DIFFICULT SITUATIONS

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While we may wish that no awkward moments or situations arise, they still do. It may be that a brother or sister has committed sin and YOU are the one to see it. It may be that someone has come to you expressing concern over some behavior you have shown. Or it may be just that there is some question of concern that needs to be checked into - it may be nothing yet it could be sin. Whichever way it goes, we need to know how to deal with these situations and with one another.

First of all, we should all remember that areas of authorized liberty are not to be disputed and wrangled over (Rom. 14). Truth is still to be taught to the weak AND to the strong (14:14). Neither side is to use their opinion as the standard; rather they are to avoid judging one another in matters of opinion (14:3). In other words, both sides are to be gracious and gentle with the other. Truth is taught, but when God allows room for differences in practice (authorized liberty) we are to follow God's example and allow the same.

This may be difficult for some who are very opinionated - very convinced of the rightness of their judgment. If someone becomes contentious over opinions - thus violating Romans 14 - it can become serious enough that we have to practice congregational discipline against them. It is just as much a sin to cause strife and disobey Romans 14 as it is to commit fornication.

Next, we may see a brother sin. What are we to do? If the sin is against us personally, we are bound by Matt. 18:15-17 to go to him first, privately - and tell him his fault. We, of course, need to do this with love & gentleness. We need to hope for the best (1 Cor. 13:7), not assuming the worst or "surmising evil" (1 Tim. 6:4). And obviously we need to have Book, chapter & verse ready to address the issue. Understand that even with the best approach, they may initially react defensive or

emotionally. But be patient and try to help them understand that your aim is to help them spiritually - though at the moment things are upsetting and uncomfortable to discuss.

If, on the other hand, we are the one being approached because of sin, what are we to do? James 1:21 says, "receive with meekness the implanted word". Meekness is strength under control. It necessitates humility and lowliness and self-control. When we are wrong, none of us likes to hear it. No one likes to feel badly or be embarrassed. And sometimes we even react defensively - blaming others for the problem or finding fault in them.

Let us be honest with ourselves & God first. If we have done something wrong, no matter how uncomfortable, we need to face up to it. And if someone has approached us concerning our sin or shortcoming, we should appreciate their love and concern for our soul. After all, they could have just "winked" at this and let us go on in sin. It may have been easier now, but in judgment we would not think them so loving and kind.

And let us not hunt for fault, resent, or hold grudges against such a person. While we know how difficult it is for us to hear about our fault, consider also how difficult it is for them to address it. They get nervous & they struggle for words that will not make matters more difficult than necessary. When they hear and see us get upset or defensive - they may even begin to sweat with the stress and concern of the moment. They may make mistakes by choosing words poorly or by saying things that upset us unintentionally. We could let that anger us, or make us think ill of them - or we could be humble and gracious, seeing past their shortcomings to what they are trying to do and why. Again, assuming the best is what Christians are to do (1 Cor. 13:7), not assuming the worst (1 Tim. 6:4).

What about when something SEEMS to be a sin, but we are not sure? What are we to do? (1) Study the issue further yourself. If you are still concerned it may be sin, then (2) go talk to this brother. As Christians we are to be mature enough to discuss these kinds of concerns among ourselves. After all, we have the same birth, the same Father, the same Lord, the same hope, etc (Eph. 4:1-6). Things may feel awkward at times, but as we gain experience in the way of Truth - we will all be the better for it.

Just consider for a moment what elders have to go through. They are obligated (we all are, but

they even more so) to teach, discuss, guide & correct (Heb. 13:17). If we are not growing in this aspect - then we will never have men qualified to be elders, much less be willing to put up with elders who do their job well.

May we all be humble, gentle and assuming the best in one another. When someone says, "Brother, may we talk?" You may be nervous, but so are they. The unity of the Spirit must be "kept" and that "diligently" (Eph. 4:3). Then we may have the peace that we all long for - genuine, Bible based, spiritually sound & growing peace. May the Lord help us all to be faithful, understanding, and spiritually mature.
